Broadening the curriculum

- There will be a number of changes to your child's curriculum and timetable in September:
- We will operate a **one week** timetable
- There will be **26 lessons** (currently we have 20 lessons)
- Lessons will last for 1 hour and 5 mins (currently they are 1h 15 min)



Years 7-9: 26 lessons

We will have a much broader curriculum at KS3


- 2 lessons of PE each week (1 at the moment)
- 1 lesson of Art each week (once a fortnight at the moment)
- 1 lesson of Music each week (once a fortnight at the moment)
- 1 lesson of Dance/Drama each week (once a fortnight at the moment)
- 1 lesson of DT per week (once a fortnight at the moment)
- 1 lesson of PSHE per week (none at the moment)

19 classroom based, academic lessons 6 sporting and creative lessons

Year 10 – 26 lessons

- We will have more options at Key Stage 4
 - 4 Options (Year 10 only have 3 options)
 - Each option has 3 lessons per week (currently there are 2 lessons per week for options)
 - 1 lesson of PE each week (Year 11 currently have no PE lessons)
 - EBacc Pathway has two additional options
 - Progress 8 Pathway has three additional options





A House System for Nova

- The House System will be at the heart of the school
- There will be Four Houses pupils have helped us to choose the names
- There will be a Head of House (teacher) and a House manager (support staff) for each house with approximately 200 pupils in each house
- A family and community feeling with House Tutor Groups
 - House Assemblies
 - Competitions academic, sporting, artistic, cultural and some just crazy...
 - House Points for everything
 - Sports Day
 - College Competition updates regularly winners get a treat at the end of the year















Vertical tutoring

- There will be 4 houses
- Each house will have 8 tutor groups
- Tutor time takes place every morning for 25 minutes (08.25 08.50)
- Your child will be in a tutor group with pupils from Years 7-11.
- There will be about 25 pupils in each tutor group
 - Friendship
 - Getting to know younger and older pupils
 - Opportunities for leadership and mentoring
 - Discussion, collaboration, celebration
 - Like a family

Extra Curricular Programme

- There will be a new, improved Extra Curricular Programme
