Y9 IMMUNISATIONS

Your Year 9 child is now due their Diphtheria, Tetanus, Polio – (Td/ IPV) & Meningitis ACWY (MenACWY) vaccinations, which will be delivered by the School Aged Immunisation Team at your child's school on **20th May 2025**. These vaccinations are offered to all boys and girls in Year 9 (aged 13/14 years).

Please respond as soon as possible to accept or decline the vaccination. Where no response is received, all young people will be offered the opportunity to discuss the vaccination and self-consent if appropriate.












ATTENDANCE MATTERS
