CATALYST STREAM



It's been an exciting beginning of the academic year for our Catalyst scholars, who have been delving into some different areas of Engineering. Year 7s have been learning about the Engineering Design Cycle based on how these materials behave. and applying that to new situations, including designing storage tidies for their lockers with limited materials and budget. They will be extending their knowledge by tackling the Toxic Popcorn challenge over the next few weeks!

Year 8 scholars have been getting stuck into technical drawing, practicing transforming their plans to reality by building a model village and they are now applying their skills to design and construct prototype emergency shelters that could be used during a variety of calamities!

Year 9 have been academically challenged during Engineering Materials lessons, where they have been learning how engineers choose certain materials for their designs

Scholars have also shown spectacular commitment within the Catalyst Stream towards developing their research and practical skills, with the majority of KS3 Catalyst scholars opting to complete CREST awards after school. CREST is a nationally recognised scheme for student-led project work in the STEM subjects (science, technology, engineering and maths). Ms Ochanda and I are excited to continue working after school with our Catalyst stream developing their passion for STEM.

Message from our **Immunisation Team**

School Vaccinations

While your child is in secondary school, they will be eligible to receive their routine vaccinations in Year 8 and Year 9.

The immunisation team is comprised of experienced nurses and support workers and will visit the school several times throughout the school year.

All year 8 students are eligible to receive the HPV vaccine. HPV is linked to several different cancers such as cervical cancer, some head, neck and throat cancers, genital cancer and anal cancers and is also responsible for genital warts.

All year 9 students are eligible for their Diptheria, Tetanus and Polio booster (Td/IPV) and at the same time, the Meningitis ACWY vaccinations (MenACWY)

A consent link sent from the school will be sent to all parents with children in these year groups so they can either accept or decline the vaccinations.

Don't worry if they miss their vaccinations in year 8 and 9, we can continue to catch these up until they leave school in year 11

















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
