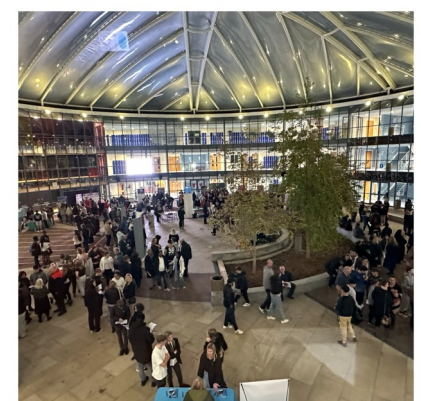

FUTURES EVENING

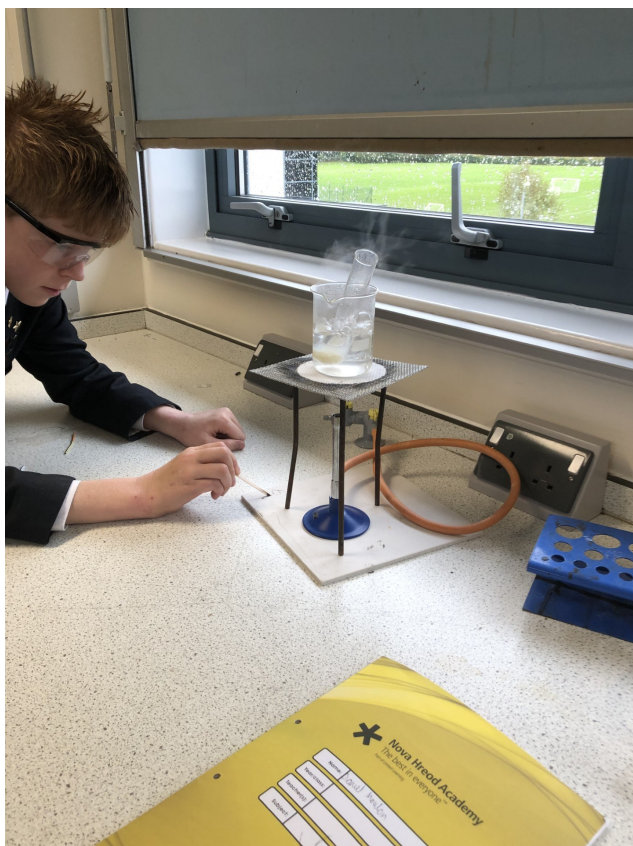

CATALYST STREAM UPDATE



As an exciting first term comes to a close, it's been great to see enthusiasm for STEM as well as admirable commitment and aptitude from our Catalyst Scholars. Year 7 Engineering students have successfully designed and evaluated a method to save the school from a toxic chemical spillage (albeit rice was our dangerous toxic waste!) and have been showing fantastic drive when presenting their results each week. In Science, they've also been getting to grips with new topics in Biology, Chemistry and Physics, showing excellent scholarship in these subjects.

Year 8s and 9s have been further developing their science understanding through covering topics including Light and Sound, the Periodic Table, Chemical Rates and

7C must also be congratulated for having the highest completion and accuracy on Tassomai for the whole of year 7, showing what an excellent start to the year the scholars have made.

Reactivity, Biological Systems and much more! Scholars are showing exceptional scholarship and drive in lessons and we're looking forward to beginning some project work in each subject next term. Meanwhile, in Engineering, Year 8 have been designing and constructing shelters using their technical drawing skills and research into the aftermath of natural disasters, while Year 9 have been busy completing their Engineering materials unit and will be developing their understanding of Engineering by looking at pneumatic systems and designs next half term.

We've been really impressed too by the spectacular commitment within the Catalyst Stream towards developing their research and practical skills, with the majority of KS3 Catalyst scholars opting to complete CREST awards after school. As such, we have three CREST clubs running simultaneously on Tuesday after school! Mr Chataika and Ms Ochanda are working with year 8 and year 7 respectively on designing fizzy drinks, while year 9 are working with myself to look at the chemical and physical changes happening when pasta is cooked, hoping to ultimately answer the question, how do you cook the best pasta!

GLOBAL CULTURAL GALA

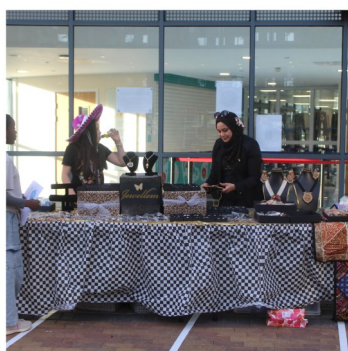

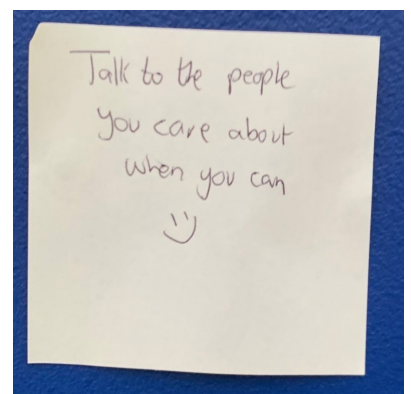
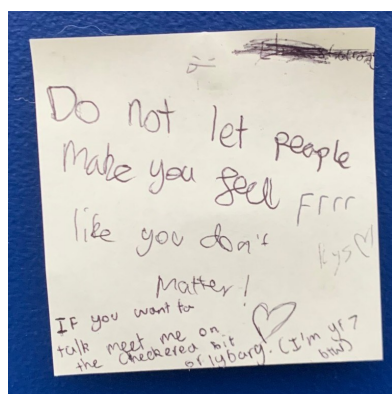
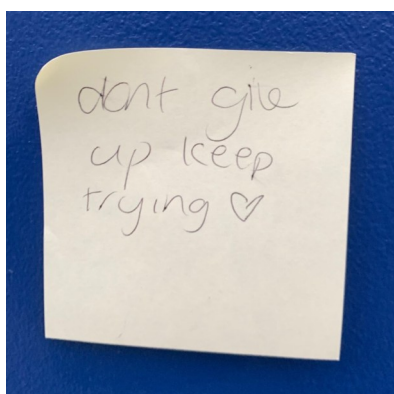
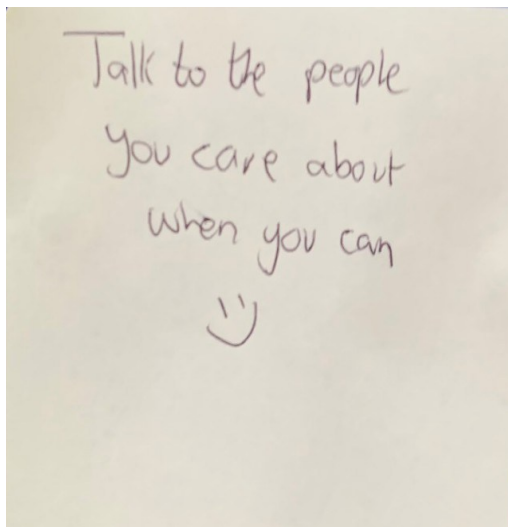
HELLO YELLOW FUNDRAISING

The following Friday students enjoyed welly wanging where students tried to throw the welly as far as they can. Congratulations to Cygnus house who won 5 points for their House.

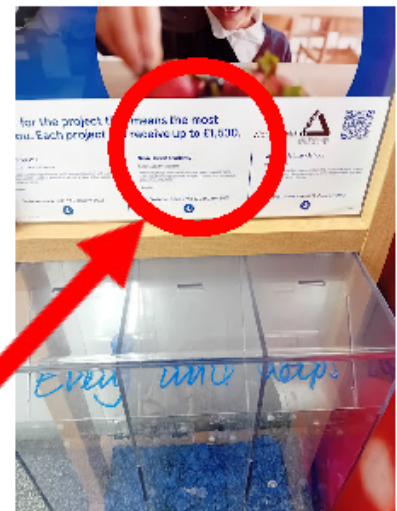


MATHS STAR OF THE TERM
