SAVE A FRIEND FORTNIGHT



For the last two weeks we have been supporting Swindon Borough Council and Wiltshire Police with their initiative to help your child - "Save a Friend" in helping children realise the dangers of getting involved with drugs or knives and how it impacts on their long term outcomes, the obvious risks to their health and wellbeing and how they can signpost their friend or themselves to agencies who can help them.

As part of raising awareness of 'Save a Friend' we had guest speakers in including Josh Connolly, a life coach with a passion for embracing change who spoke about tackling the Konica Crime Culture and the behaviours surrounding an action to a feeling and how to deal with it.

In PSHE lessons and assemblies children were shown videos and information on how to spot the signs of danger, if they are making bad/risky decisions, or feel the need to carry a weapon and how to support a friend and contact the relevant agencies that can help them.

We were thrilled to meet all the Year 5/6 pupils and their parents at last week's Open Evening. Students had the chance to experience 'real-life' lessons in Food Technology, Science, English and PE whilst the parents had the chance to hear from the Headmaster.

If you missed our Open Evening, or would like another chance to look around the school our next Open Mornings are on Wednesday 2nd and Tuesday 15th October.



















LEAVING A LEGACY
