Message From The Headteacher

One of the poems which our Year 10 and 11 students study for their GCSE in English Literature is Wilfred Owen's Exposure. The poem describes the exhausting and monotonous conditions faced by soldiers during World War One - the terrifying weather: wind, rain and snow.

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At the heart of the poem, is a tragic and haunting image of the ghosts of the soldiers returning home to their loved ones, only to find the "shutters and doors, all closed: on us the doors are closed."

The centenary of the First World War has now passed; it is 101 years since the end of the war and the number of survivors continues, sadly, to reduce. There is a risk that our collective memory of the sacrifice people made for us during this and other conflicts might fade. It is important we don't close the doors on their ghosts.

At Nova this week we held an incredibly moving ceremony to mark Remembrance Day with an installation of thousands of poppies created by our students, poetry reading and the Last Post played by a bugler. It was a moving and important shared experience and a further reminder of how respectful and community minded Nova students are.

On Monday 11th November, our cadets attended school in uniform and at 11 o'clock the whole school observed a respectful silence at the call of the Last Post, played in the atrium by Captain Ian Standley from the Salvation Army.



For the second year running, our students have worked with integrity and a great sense of drive to produce over 15,000 poppies to be placed on the flower beds in the atrium, forming a striking tribute to those that have lost their lives in conflict. This year's display included a large number of white poppies in remembrance of those people killed who were not soldiers, to reflect the role of peace in society.
