

We visited Arnos Vale Cemetery on a very cold, but beautifully frosty morning. We then travelled into Bristol Temple Meads

Station to photograph commuters, crowds and the very old stone building and to Bristol Cathedral which was magnificent. Both groups had the opportunity to photograph the Planetarium, a huge mirror ball on the harbourside. The many galleries we visited were informative and will help to lead these students onto create many different kinds of artworks. The Pacita Abad exhibition at Spike Island was particularly fascinating. The curators gave us a tour and told us that they have chosen to hang the painted textile works so that you can walk all around them, observing the front of the textile pieces as well as the stitches on the back. This is only the second time ever that the works have been displayed in this way.



SCIENCE TRIP TO BBC BRISTOL

This week, four students visited BBC Bristol to take part in a STEM careers workshop, where they were introduced to some people with some of the coolest roles in the BBC. The workshops and activities meant that the students met individuals from a wide range of backgrounds, opening up the students' eyes to the huge range of opportunities and roles relating to their science, technology, engineering and maths subjects that could lead to jobs like the STEM ambassadors in the media.

The BBC STEM ambassadors were a truly amazing group of people, and very inspiring. Using their own career experiences, they each designed and delivered practical challenges for the students to work on. We took part in seven STEM challenges, including weather forecasting; news deployment planning; production planning and budgeting for a TV show; coding and website personalisation; user-testing games and apps; design and engineering; 3D animation and communication. We had a fantastic day and came away feeling truly inspired at the huge variety of prospects that studying STEM subjects can offer.
