

MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL


Spring has arrived, the Easter holidays are just around the corner, and we are now two thirds of the way through the academic year.

Debating Competition



This term we held the first Nova Debating Competition. Students had the opportunity to discuss and argue some key issues, helping to develop their critical thinking and public speaking skills.

After debating the topic: "All forms of animal testing should be made illegal" in tutor groups, the best team from each tutor was selected to compete in the inter-tutor round. After this head to head round, the top four teams from each house were selected for the house final.

In the house final, a new debate topic was presented: "How do we reduce the rate of repeat offenders?". Each team was assigned a different viewpoint to research and prepare an argument for. These four teams had the opportunity to present their arguments to the whole of their house (around 200 people!), which they all did brilliantly. House staff had the difficult job of selecting one team to represent the whole house in the School Final!

The final arrived and the competition really heated up! Each of the 4 groups presented their solution for reducing the rate of criminal reoffenders, with other teams trying to argue against their viewpoints. Mr Wells and Mr Thomas had the incredibly difficult job of selecting the team who showed the best teamwork, confidence, research and ability to debate! Although every team and every student was exceptional in what is a very difficult and nervewracking situation, there could only be one winner.

A huge well done to the 2019 champions of debate. The competition was great fun and the debates were outstanding.

Year 10 Mock Interviews



A team from Arval UK came into school to give Year 10 experience of a real interview in preparation for their further education and employment applications.

Students completed an application form in advance and were interviewed by one of Arval's staff. At the end of the day, the interviewers each selected one candidate that they felt had been the strongest from the students they interviewed, and these students were awarded certificates for "getting the job", which were handed out in assembly.



Be Prepared Day at Swindon Academy

Year 11 were invited to Swindon Academy where they took part in an event to help them reflect on their career aspirations and prepare for their exams. During the morning, they took part in a programme which aims to train their brains on how to cope under exam day pressure. They were introduced to the science of what happens in the brain during exams and given real-time techniques on how to be in total control in an exam simulation workshop.

Students were able to try out some level 3 subjects in a selection of taster sessions that they had chosen in advance. They took part in a careers session and were encouraged to think about their university aspirations, using software to help them identify courses which suit their abilities, skills and aspirations.

Swindon College Apprenticeship Taster

A group of Year 10 students went to Swindon College for an apprenticeship taster day, where they learnt how apprenticeships work and found out about some of the opportunities available. During the morning they were given some useful information about apprenticeships and courses and are using the information they gained to consider their future opportunities. Lucky Sam won the apprenticeship quiz and received a £20 Love to Shop voucher.



Tunnocks Teacake challenge

Year 10 food technology students were set the challenge to research and create a chef inspired plate using a Tunnocks Teacake, designed to practice plating and presentation skills in preparation for Year 11. Mrs Moore decided to give it a competitive edge by introducing a prize for the best creations.

It was so difficult to select only the top three as they were fantastic, but 1st place was awarded to Phoebe, who created a truly restaurant quality dish. Robbie took 2nd place for creativity and dedication to the task, creating a wristwatch, and 3rd place went to Ryan for his sophisticated design. Commendation awards went to Antwan for using high skills and making his own honey comb, and to Charlie who used previously learnt skills to make his own meringue.

The winners each received a personalised apron which they are looking forward to wearing in future practicals.



Nova Chefs in National Final

Congratulations to Lizzie, Julia and Abby who reached the final of the Teflon Diamond Standard Awards. The finalists were selected for their professional entries and strong personal statements. On the day of the final, they had 90 minutes to create their dishes which were judged by a team of professional chefs including celebrity chef Lesley Waters. We were very excited and pleased to have Abby and Lizzie declared joint runners up.

When the judging was complete, we were treated to a 'live' food demonstration in the theatre: two delicious dishes of grilled pineapple, smoked chicken and salsa; and coconut and cardamom meringues with lime Chantilly cream and fruit salad. Lesley Waters was ably assisted by Nova's Julia and Lizzie.

All three girls can be very proud of themselves for the standard of their food and their professionalism.



STEM

National Education Pack Launched at Nova

Year 10 GCSE triple science students were treated to a hands-on lesson about fuel cell technology and hydrogen power, when a team of experts launched a new set of teaching resources at Nova, developed by Arval in partnership with The Hydrogen Hub.

The students were able to try out hydrogen fuel cell powered vehicles, and get their hands on a fuel cell as part of their chemistry lesson, prior to the resource being made available nationally for science teachers to

use in the classroom.

Having the opportunity to see first-hand how the technology can be used for cars in a real world application was a real bonus for the students.







Science trips

Dr Clapp and twelve Year 10 students went to the University of Reading for a STEM day. They worked in groups on a rotation of scientific activities. As well as completing some scientific challenges, they were introduced to meteorology in a session where they learnt how weather patterns are predicted. Scientists from Proctor and Gamble showed them how to make moisturiser and sunscreens, and in the afternoon there was a Big Bang science event involving explosions and dry ice.

Almost a hundred Year 7 and 8 students went to the Big Bang Fair at Birmingham NEC. They were able to try out scientific activities, see some mind-boggling shows and meet engineers and scientists from some of the UK's biggest companies and find out about the opportunities available in Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths.

A Big Adventure in the Big Apple!


In the week of half term, over 30 students and four lucky members of staff had the amazing opportunity to go to New York on a Creative Arts Culture trip!


Both Asa and Kenneth agreed that this was an amazing trip and they felt privileged to have been chosen out of the whole of year 8 to attend.



Stellar Science and Mystery Maths

Year 5 pupils from Greenmeadow Primary, Rodbourne Cheney Primary and Moredon Primary schools joined us for a STEM based day which was packed full with activities and scientific surprises.

Students took part in a series of lessons and activities designed to help them explore and investigate. They acted as detectives to solve a crime in our Mystery Maths workshop, explored scientific matters and had an introduction to computer coding, where they learnt about e-safety and the importance of strong passwords before being challenged to hack into the school computers! A highlight of the day was the spectacular science show in the Nova Hreod Theatre where Dr Clapp shared her explosive scientific talents. All the visiting pupils were assigned to one of Nova's four houses for the day and were expertly looked after by our own house representatives, who did an outstanding job.







CELEBRATING SUCCESS

Four Year 8 students competed against 20 other schools from Wiltshire, Somerset and Oxfordshire at a UKMT maths challenge at Royal Wootton Bassett Academy. Some of the teams in the challenge were mixed Year 8/9 teams whereas Nova's team of four Year 8s worked together extremely well to finish in 10th place. A special rewards assembly took place in the theatre with a surprise concert from American singer Keelie Walker as part of her UK tour. LITERACY

Year 11 students travelled to Bath Forum where they were able to hear form some of the poets that they are studying in their GCSE. They particularly enjoyed the performance from award winning poet John Agard, and also got to hear from Poet Laureate Carol Ann Duffy and a variety of others. The day also included a talk from an AQA examiner who gave them helpful hints and tips about how to answer exams questions; they were also able to ask questions of the poets.
