Over the last fortnight, we've welcomed our new Year 7s and welcomed back our Year 11s during our very first ever **Launchpad** week. It was brilliant to see the Year 7s begin to settle into secondary school with our support. Year 11 have also made a big transition into the most important year of their education so far. It was impressive to see how both these year groups have already started to rise to the challenges they're faced with. Years 8-10 have now joined us too so the 2018-19 academic year is now in full flow.

GCSE results

You may have seen in the local media that last academic year saw another rise in Nova's GCSE results. **69%** of students achieved a 4 or above in English and mathematics and 52% of students achieved at least a 5 in both subjects – this is now the government's 'basics' measure. I would like to congratulate all of the Nova students celebrating their GCSE results. These continue to consolidate the school's strong progress in recent years. I'd also like to thank our staff for their encouragement, support and enthusiasm towards ensuring all students meet their potential.

This will, of course continue into the 2018-19 academic year as we further embed our values of **Drive**, **Integrity**, **Scholarship** and **Contribution**.

I hope you enjoy reading about the events that have occurred already this year at Nova and finding out more about some of the changes we have put in place over the summer.

Launchpad



The new year started with Launchpad week for Year 7 and Year 11 and to celebrate the theme we were treated to an inspirational talk from British astronaut **Ryan** MacDonald who told us all about his application to be one of the first

people to colonise Mars.

Students were enthralled by what Ryan had to tell them about his personal journey and his journey into space. They were also very puzzled by the fact that it was going to be a one way mission. Ryan, a Physics graduate at Oxford University, has always had a strong interest in astrophysics and joined the exoplanet research group at the University of Cambridge's Institute of Astronomy. In 2013, the Dutch organisation Mars One opened a worldwide astronaut selection programme, for which Ryan has been shortlisted to the final 100. Ryan told us the fascinating story of his journey which could potentially see him jetting off on a mission to Mars. Students were captivated by the story of his journey and his dedication to achieving his dreams. Ryan told us that he is one of just 4 people in the UK who could be selected. In September next year he will spend two weeks isolated in a simulation Mars habitat to decide whether he qualifies to become one of the 24 candidates selected to be an astronaut on the mission. It's a truly inspirational story of a young man's perseverance to achieve his ambitions.

We were very grateful to Ryan for coming into school to tell us about his own **Launchpad** moment.



Communication with parents

At Nova Hreod Academy we use a range of tools to help parents and students.

The School Gateway to communicate messages to parents via email and text, and by using the SchoolGateway app or website. Our newsletters are sent by email as well as being uploaded to the school website. All school reports are sent home via the School Gateway.

All students and parents now have an **Epraise** account to help keep track of reward points and home study. Epraise users can see details of home study and their child's timetables. Instructions about how to use epraise have been emailed to parents and added to the "parent letters" page of the school website.

To allow you to receive up to date messages and information from the school, please ensure that your email address is registered with the school.

Nova Hreod Academy is a "cashless" school which uses **ParentPay** to manage payments for school meals, trips and other payment items. All parents have been issued with a user name and activation code to use ParentPay.
