understand and apply their learning from the units they have studied. These assessments are called Best in Everyone assessments. Following the assessments, parents will receive a report which will be discussed in more detail at Achievement Review Day for students in Years 7 -10. Year 11 parents' evening, which was scheduled for next month, is being postponed until the new year and we will confirm

the date as soon as we can.

In the parent's section of the school website, you will find a detailed guide to the BiE assessments together with the timetable for both Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 assessments, which start on 9th November. Students are being encouraged to revise for these assessments and we have also supported them in class and in assemblies.

#### Home study in Year 11

Every day Mr Foster and I remind Year 11 students that the best way for them to learn and make progress is to do their homework in a timely and diligent fashion. As a school, we give students a week to do their homework so they can avoid problems, like the internet dropping out and seek help with concepts they are struggling with.

A number of students are leaving home study to the last minute and then experiencing technical problems or stress due to limited understanding. Work is often then rushed and completed just to avoid a detention, rather than actually understood and completed thoroughly. Please help us remind them to do their homework as close to the day set as possible and seek support if they need it. Working together we can make this a very successful year for them.

# **POP UP LIBRARY**




to increase the number of books available to these year groups.

#### AND PREFECTS.




Prefects are a group of Year 11 student who have a range of responsibilities and duties and support positive behaviour around the academy.
