

MRS UNWIN'S REVISION CORNER

Each issue I will be sharing one great revision technique your child could be using at home. Sometimes scholars want to revise but don't know the best way to go about it – Mrs Unwin's revision corner is here to help! Remember, revision is not something just to be done the night before an exam, the science of learning says spaced practice is important or in other words; little and often.

Whatever method your child uses for revision, make sure that they're **thinking hard**. If they're not thinking hard (e.g. just copying), precious time is being wasted.

This issue is all about knowledge dumps.

How to do a knowledge dump


Step 1: Choose a topic – preferably one that you have identified as a weakness.

Step 2: Set a short time limit (max 5 minutes) and write down everything you know about that topic.

Step 3: Compare what you have written to a knowledge organizer or revision guide.

Step 4: Add in anything you missed and correct anything you got wrong in a different colour.

Step 5: Repeat until you have all the key information!



What's on our minds can be the hardest subject.

So what's on yours?

Sometimes, the world can feel like a scary place.

That's why this World Mental Health Day, we've set the nation a different kind of homework.

Because talking about the hardest subjects on our mind can help ease our stress, and reduce our anxiety.

And working on a shared task like this one is a brilliant way to start a proper chat if you need a hand.

1

Ask your parent, carer, or an adult you trust if they'll help you with your homework.

Tell them not to worry - nothing will be marked, and they won't even need a calculator! Get talking

2

If you're not sure where to start, try writing or drawing your worries or fears on the front cover of this exercise. You can use the box or go outside the lines. Remember: there are no right or wrong answers.

3

Now, spend time together talking through any worries one by one. Discuss questions such as:

How does it make you feel? What are you most afraid might happen? Would it help if you had more information?



Even if we're used to talking together, it can be hard to open up about our worries or fears, particularly the more serious or scary ones. Perhaps you're afraid that talking about them might make you both worry more,

but the reality is the opposite is more likely to be true. When we talk about the hardest subjects, we don't have to have all the answers. The important thing is to listen without judgment, and try not to rush to resolve the problem.

This year, they recognised the organisation of Swindon's group of school librarians who work together to provide opportunities for students throughout the town. The Festival is run by the librarians from the twelve schools and celebrates reading, writing and illustration.

2023 will be the 16th year of the Swindon Youth Festival of Literature. It takes place every year in November with twelve Swindon Secondary Schools involved and brings authors, poets and illustrators into schools, together with a headline event at the Wyvern Theatre. This year we are very excited to have Jacqueline Wilson as the

headline author.

The Festival includes competitions in creative writing, poetry and illustration run by each school which are then put forward for an overall winner. The winners of the inschool illustration competition are invited to a workshop run by illustrator Steve Antony.
