## A WELCOME FROM OUR NEW SENIOR ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

Firstly, let me introduce myself. My name is Dr Radice, and I'm an English specialist with many years of experience working in a wide variety of schools. I joined the school in September 2020 with the remit to make the school's culture even stronger and to build on the achievements of my predecessor, Mr Wilson, who had been working with faculty leaders to strengthen the Nova curriculum.

One of the aspects of my cultural work across the school has been to introduce wholeschool poetry. All students are working together on memorising classic poetry. Last term, we learned 'Ozymandias' by Percy Bysshe Shelley. This term, our poem is particularly relevant to the month which contains Remembrance Day: 'The Charge of the Light Brigade' by Alfred, Lord Tennyson. It's been great to see so many students joining in with this whole-school initiative. It has a powerful unifying and uplifting effect in these difficult times.



Another aspect of my work has been to encourage and model excellent manners in classrooms and corridors. This is simple but very powerful. A simple 'good morning' or 'good afternoon' makes the school a more cheerful and civilised place, and brightens everyone's day.

This month we have celebrated the English language with a socially-distanced Swindon Youth Festival of Literature. This is a fantastic initiative which is organised by the librarians of the secondary schools in Swindon and it was heartwarming to see how the students engaged with the virtual workshops and competitions.

I've been impressed with how much work has already been done on making the curriculum at Nova rich and coherent. I'm currently working with faculty leaders on even more effective ways of making this broad range of knowledge 'stick' better through study techniques such as spaced practice and interleaving.

### SWINDON VIRTUAL YOUTH FESTIVAL OF LITERATURE 9th – 13th November 2020

The 13th Swindon Youth Festival of Literature which celebrates creativity, writing and reading, is a project coordinated by the librarians of the secondary schools across Swindon. For the first time, due to COVID19 restrictions, the Festival had to take place virtually, and our authors and poets were seen on the big screen in the classroom rather than in person. Students from Haydon Wick Primary School also got to be involved in the Festival. Normally they would have attended a workshop here at Nova but instead this year they watched a recording at their school by the author **Phil Earle**. Phil read the first chapter from his new book *"Pickles, the Dog that Saved the World (Cup)"* which is being released in March 2021.

Alexander Gordon Smith was our school author this year and he told some very entertaining stories of his childhood and younger years which inspired him to start writing his horror books.

During the week we also had talks by the performance poet and SYFL regular, **Ash Dickinson** who got the students to create their own rhymes and verses.

The headline event, which normally takes place at the Wyvern Theatre, was the author **Sally Gardner**, author of *'Maggot Moon'* and *'The Silver Blade'* who talked about being dyslexic and read a short extract from her book *"Invisible in a Bright Light."* 





In advance of the Festival, Creative Writing, Poetry and Illustration Competitions were run. We had lots of entries across all the competitions with our winning entries then being submitted against the other Swindon Secondary Schools.

#### **Poetry Competition**

Students were invited to write a poem on the subject of Freedom. There were two categories: Year 7-8 and Year 9-11. Congratulations to Austin, winner of the Year 7-8 category and Luke, who won the Year 9-11 category. Both students reached the SYFL final.


Students were asked to write up to 500 words based on "What do you see when you look at this picture? " Two students were selected to go forward to the SYFL final:

Special awards were presented to students who had demonstrated the Nova values of Drive, Integrity, Scholarship and Contribution.






