MRS UNWIN'S REVISION CORNER

This edition of Mrs Unwin's revision corner focuses on the use of practice questions. The factor that tends to limit students using this technique is access to the exam questions. For GCSE students the 2 main exam boards are AQA and Edexcel (although there are others). Students can follow the links to access past papers and mark schemes:

AQA | Find past papers and mark schemes

Past papers | Past exam papers | Pearson qualifications

Failing that, if a scholar messages their teacher with a request for exam questions I am sure they would be happy to provide!

Once they have some questions the scholar should read the question and annotate in the way they have been shown by each subject area. They should then try and complete the question without the use of notes. They then check their answers against the mark scheme and finally do some further revision on the areas they did not do as well in.

quiz winners.



This term brings on more ways to contribute to House and DISC standings.


- High attendance will mean not only ALT wins and chocolates for tutor groups at the top but also weekly DISC points are given for full attendance.


self would have loved the vast array of enrichment and prospects on offer.






EURO SPACE CENTRE




When we arrived at the Euro Space centre we took part in some of the astronaut training facilities (which involved lots of spinning and being dizzy!) as well as simulations where we all had a role to play in docking a satellite onto the ISS and returning the satellite home. The Space Centre is an amazing facility with loads of activities for students to learn about space exploration, try out some of the equipment used by astronauts and developers, and experience zero gravity.

We also visited a local castle at night, where we enjoyed a tour using fire torches as the only source of light!



YEAR 10 SCHOLARS IN GLOBAL AVIATION CHALLENGE

We are excited to be involved in a collaborative research project with the Institute for Research in Schools (IRIS) with Year 10 scholars who are interested in STEM, aviation and engineering.

The project, called "Future Flight" was launched on 5th October, when Dr Spreadbury went to Cotswold Airport in Kemble to visit a company called ZeroAvia, a leading company developing new hydrogen-electric, zero-emission engines for commercial aircraft.

The launch included demonstrations and an introduction to clean flight technologies, including a tour of ZeroAvia's fuel cell ad electric motor labs and the testbed <u>Dornier 228 aircraft</u>.

As part of 'Future Flight', scholars will work on projects alongside their normal lessons to explore the concepts and technologies that propel aviation, from aerodynamics to hydrogen-electric propulsion. Scholars will use new software to investigate the most efficient and economical ways to fly a commercial plane route using new sustainable fuels and technologies, and it's hoped they may come up with fresh innovative ideas.
