


ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Special congratulations to the four Nova Swindon in the next round for their age groups.







CATALYST STEM TASTER SESSION

TRIPS AND VISITS



Parentpay has recently introduced One-click payments, which allows you to make school purchases using your bank account instead of a credit card.

It is important to know that One-click payments can take **up to three working days** to collect the funds from your bank (up to ten days during the setup period), and the payment will fail if there is not enough money in the bank account to cover the purchases at the time the money is collected, causing a delay in getting goods or a cancellation of a place. It will also cause a delay in receiving refunds.




