A MESSAGE FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

I hope all of our scholars and their families had a relaxing Christmas break - it has been lovely to welcome everyone back to Nova in 2024 and see the fantastic start that is being made to the New Year. We finished last year strongly, with our scholars



really showing the value of contribution to their communities by signing cards for those in local hospices, donating to our Reverse Advent appeal and singing at two local care homes.

On the last day of term we celebrated with each year group in turn and revealed our Scholars of the Term. Congratulations again to Jessenia (Year 7), Peri (Year 8), Laila (Year 9), Hamilton (Year 10) and Mia (Year 11) who have been recognised for their excellent DISC values and attitudes to their studies.

We really value the importance of home study at Nova and I love to see how well our scholars are doing with their respective subjects and online platforms so I have picked out some highlights. So far this year our scholars have demonstrated their scholarship through home study by:

- earning over 5 million points on Languagenut (currently placing us 6th in the World!)
- logging over 3,132 hours of careful reading on Sparx Reader
- completing 16,387 lessons on Bedrock
- answering 731,462 questions correctly on Sparx Maths (with 346 of our scholars also improving their times tables)
- answering 1,004,019 questions correctly on Tassomai and completing 37,555 daily goals

Having high attendance levels plays a key role in success at Nova and rewards are given to those that maintain the best attendance. At the end of last term a slightly different reward was offered for scholars with greater than 95% attendance - the opportunity to watch a member of the senior leadership team take part in a Friday challenge which involved eating some very random food items. Luckily for me it was Mr Unwin's name that came out of the hat so please read on to find out what delights he got to try!




rather revolting concoction which included mackerel, mustard, lemon juice, pineapple and pickles.

Behaviour was exemplary and everyone enjoyed themselves Mrs Derham, Head of Drama





MRS UNWIN'S REVISION CORNER

With the BiEs in full swing here are some top tips for helping your child revise:

- 1. Find a space where they can work at a table that is quiet and away from distractions (study base runs after school every day if you do not have this space at home).
- 2. Agree a length of time with your child to study (no more than an hour without a break is best some people need shorter chunks).
- 3. Agree not just a subject, but which topic your child is going to revise and what they are going to do (e.g. online platform, testing with flashcards, knowledge dumps etc).
- 4. Get them to show you what they have achieved and celebrate their hard work!

On the final day of term, each year had an awards ceremony during their year assemblies. Awards were presented by our Vice Principal Mr Nash for the following catagories -



- Star Slips ***


Congratulations to all the winners
