

ILLUSTRATION WORKSHOP

On Tuesday 17th May two of our students, Szantal year 8 and Ola year 9, attended an illustration workshop run by Steve Antony at The Deanery School. They were joined by students from the Deanery, Great Western Academy, Highworth Warneford, Lawn Academy, Dorcan Academy, St Joseph's and Ridgeway. Steve was born in Swindon, went to college locally to study illustration and is Swindon Libraries Patron to Children's Reading Services. Steve spoke about how he was inspired by art when he was younger to get creative. He also told the students that he is colour blind so only chooses a few colours when deciding what ones to use or his Designer and Editor will make suggestions. To get ideas he told them that he reads the news and listens to what is going on around him when he is


out in different places. He got students to use their senses to come up with one word which he asked them to write down. These words were put in a box, mixed up and then given out to different students randomly. He asked them then to build from this word by thinking of things associated with it. They then spent the workshop building on this one word to create an illustration.
