Attendance Matters

Being in school matters. Students must be in school every day learning with their classroom teachers. If students are not in school, they are missing out on vital learning.

If students have an attendance of 90%, that means they have missed 20 days in the year and that equates to around 100 hours of learning missed.

If students have an attendance of 80%, that means they will have missed 40 days in the year and that equates to around 200 hours of learning missed.

As a school, we consistently promote the importance of attendance through our rewards system.



Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. The students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSEs.






2. Give 100% effort,


